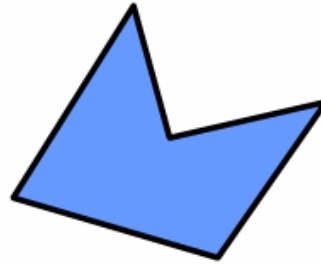


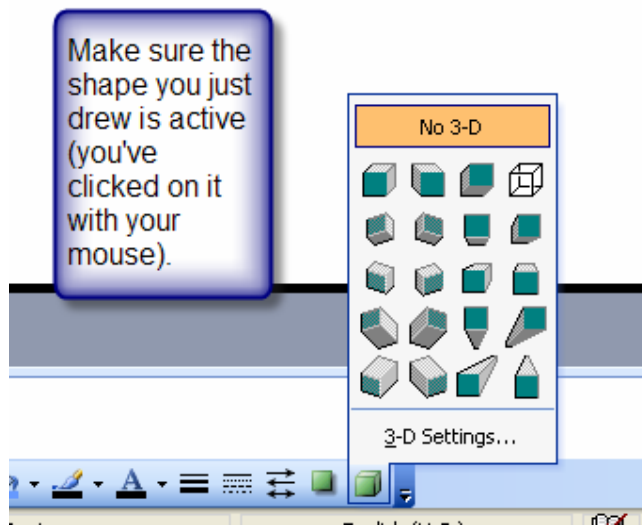
Creating 3-D Geometry in PowerPoint 2003

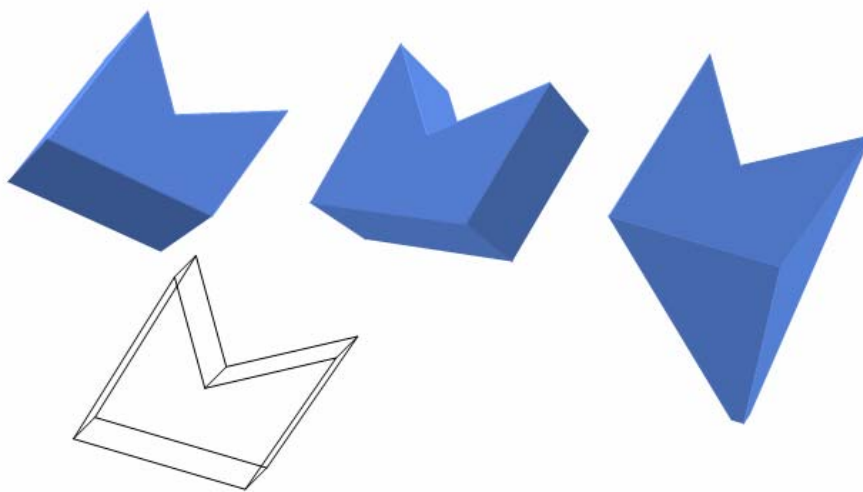
Make a Shape using either the “Autoshapes → Basic Shapes” menu, or the “Autoshapes → Lines → Freeform” drawer. Like so:



Now choose what type of 3-D look you'd like using the menu below.



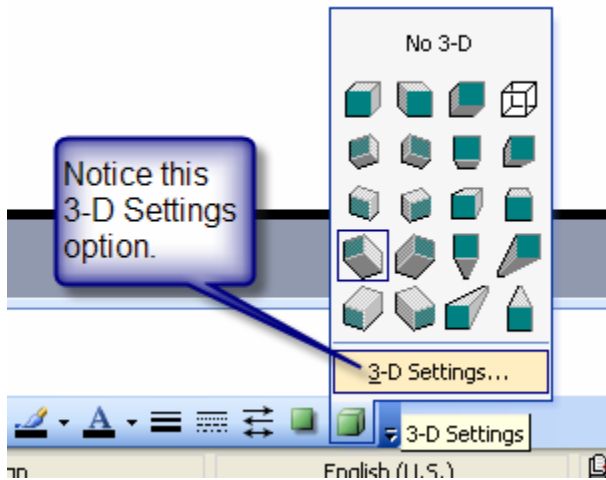
Here is a variety of 3-D objects created from this original shape.



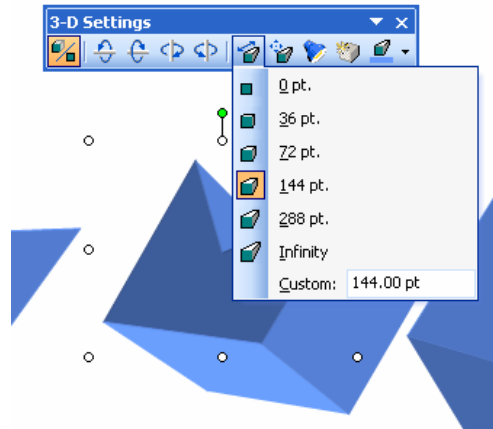
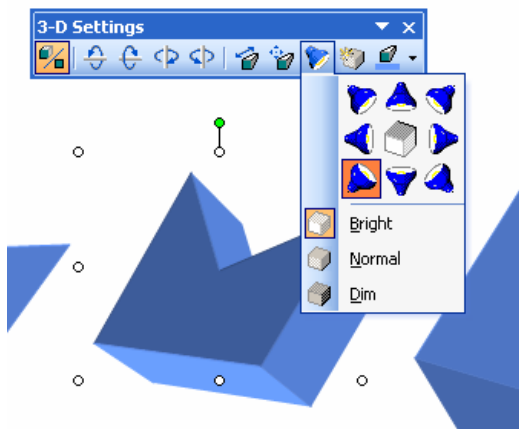

With one of your 3-D objects highlighted, find the “3-D Settings” menu.



You can change the direction that the light hits the object from or the “height” of the object.



Or you can change various perspectives. →

Or tilt the objects in different directions. ↓
