

Installing Office 2007 + MathType

(after you've had MathType up and running on a prior Office version):

1. Install Office 2007.
2. Reinstall MathType (6 or higher) using the 30-day free trial. The MathType product key should be automatically found for you.
3. To open an inline equation, use Ctrl-Alt-Q. If you don't like Ctrl-Alt-Q, then you've got to Customize the keyboard command from the Microsoft Word side (watch video). Personally I use Ctrl-E.
 - a. Click office button.
 - b. Go to **Word Options** (bottom of window).
 - c. Go to **Customize** tab (left-hand menu).
 - d. Go to **Keyboard Shortcuts Customize** button (bottom of window).
 - e. Under categories, scroll down to **Macros**.
 - f. In the Macros list (right panel), scroll to **MTCommand_InsertInlineEqn**.
 - g. Click in the text box "**Press new shortcut key**" and then press Ctrl-E (or your preferred keyboard command) on your keyboard.
 - h. Click **Assign**.
4. If you already had a keyboard command for closing an equation, it should still work after the Office 2007 installation. However, if When an equation is opened, you can use the command Ctrl-F4. If you don't like this, you can change it.
 - a. Open an equation.
 - b. Go to the **Preferences** tab.
 - c. Then go to the **Customize Keyboard** option.
 - d. Under the **Menu Commands** list, go to the sub-list called **File Menu**.
 - e. Click on the command **Close and Return to** (Ctrl+F4).
 - f. Click in the text box "**Enter new shortcut key(s)**" and then press Ctrl-E (or your preferred keyboard command) on your keyboard.
 - g. Click **Assign**.
